






Jacques Chirac (1932-2019)



Jacques Rene Chirac was a former politician who served as the 7th President of France from 1995-2007. In addition; he also served as the Prime Minister of France from 1974-1976 and 1986-1988. Chirac completed his degree from Science Po and also attended a term at Harvard University and at the Ecolenationaled' administration. During his tenure as President, his policies were based on dirigisme, contrary to the laissez-faire policies implemented by the Margaret Thatcher led- United Kingdom government. He was also known famously for opposing the U.S led assault on Iraq. In his early days of his political career, he was nicknamed as the 'bulldozer' for his skill at getting things done. In 1972, he was appointed as the Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development and became popular for listening to farmers' interests. Chirac was nominated as the Prime Minister in 1974 under the leadership of the then President Valéry Giscard d'Estaing. He proceeded to build up his political party, the Rally for the Republic (RPR). Later in 1977, he was appointed as the Mayor of Paris. Chirac was once again appointed as the Prime Minister under President Mitterand's leadership. Ultimately in 1995 in the Presidential election, Chirac was elected with a majority of 52%. At the age of 69, Chirac faced his fourth presidential campaign in 2002 and won the re-election by a landslide, with 82 percent vote. Shortly after leaving office, he launched the Foundation Chirac in June 2008. Chirac suffered from frail health and memory loss in later life. Chirac died at his home in Paris on 26 September 2019.

YICTOR HUGO (1802-1885)

was a very famous French poet. He was also a novelist. His most famous novel is Les Misérables which was written in 1862. His most famous poetry collections are Les Contemplations and La Légende des siècles

CHARLES PIERRE BAUDELAIRE (1821 - 1867)

was a French poet and a translator of Edgar Allan Poe. He is known for his book Les Fleurs du mal. It's about the changing nature of beauty during industrialization in Paris

JEAN DE LA FONTAINE (1621 - 1695)

was one of the most famous French poets of the 17th century. He has written many famous poems, but he is best known for his fables. In 1692 he had published a revised edition of the contes.

ANNE-MARIE ALBIACH (1937 - 2012)

was a contemporary French poet. She was also a translator. She coedited the magazine Siécle à mains, where she first published her translation of Louis Zukofsky.

PIERRE REVERDY (1889 - 1960)

Reverdy arrived in Paris in October 1910, devoting his initial years to writing. He helped create the magazine Nord-Sud in 1917. All his famous works including Cravates de chanvre are published there

JACQUES PRÉVERT (1900 - 1977)

was a French poet and screenwriter. His notable works are pour faire le portrait d'un oiseau and cet amour. Prevert's poems are translated into many languages around the world.



Facts about the Eiffel Tower

- 1) The Eiffel Tower is located on the Champ de Mars in Paris, France.
- 2)The Eiffel Tower was constructed from 1887 to 1889. It took 2 years 2 months and 5 days to build the Eiffel Tower.
- 3) The Eiffel Tower was originally built as the entrance arch for the World Fair in 1889.
- 4)The Eiffel Tower was built by Gustave Eiffel's engineering company 'Compagnie des Établissements Eiffel'. The architects of the Eiffel tower were Stephen Sauvestre, Maurice Koechlin, Émile Nouguier.
- 5) The height of the Eiffel Tower is 324 m. It is the tallest building in France.
- 6)The Tower remained the tallest man—made structure for 41 years, until superseded by the Chrysler Building in New York.
- 7)The construction started on 28th January 1887 and ended on 31st March 1889.
- 8)Construction of the Eiffel Tower cost about 1.5 million (7,799,401.31 French Gold Francs).
- 9) The Eiffel Tower weighs 10,000 tons.
- 10) The French kept the nickname of the Tower 'La Dame de Fer' which means 'Iron Lady'.
- 11) The Tower has 108 stories, with 1,710 steps. The visitors can only climb stairs to the first platform.
- 12)One elevator travels a total distance of 64,001 miles (103,000 kilometers) a year.
- 13)Around 50 tons of paint is added to the Eiffel Tower every 7 years to protect it from rust.
- 14) The Eiffel Tower was designed to be wind resistant. As the sun-facing side of the Tower heats up, it causes the top to move as much as 7 inches away from the sun.
- 15) The temperature also increases the height of the Tower by 6 inches.
- 16)Eiffel Tower was used as a radio antenna.
- 17) The Eiffel Tower was supposed to be built in Barcelona but the Tower's design was rejected by the Spain.
- 18) Erika La Tour had married the Eiffel Tower.
- 19)It took around 300 workers to assemble the 18,038 pieces of wrought iron and 2.5 million rivets of the Eiffel Tower.
- 20) The Eiffel Tower shares its birthday with Nintendo and Adolf Hitler.
- 21)During WW1 the Eiffel Tower was used to help the Allied forces to jam German communications.
- 22) Around the world there are around 30 replicas of the Eiffel Tower.
- 23)Building the Eiffel Tower was safe. Only one person died in the construction of the Eiffel Tower.
- 24) A Laboratory for science experiments is located at the Eiffel Tower.

WORLD FAMOUS PERSONALITIES FROM FRANCE



MARIE CURIE.

Marie Curie was one of greatest scientists of the world. She was the first woman who was awarded the Nobel Prize for conducting pioneering research on radioactivity, and the only woman to win it two times. Born on 7 November 1867 in Poland, she attended her education at University of Paris and discovered Radium and Polonium. She once said that, "Nothing in life is to be feared, it is only to be understood. Now is the time to understand more, so that we may fear less." The world will not forget her work which helped in the growth of the world. She died on 4 July 1934.



NAPOLÉON BONAPARTE

Napoleon Bonaparte was a famous French military strategist and an Emperor.

He safeguarded aspects of the French Revolution by assuming control of France. He launched military campaigns across Europe making France a dominant power in Europe and helped to spread the ideas behind the French revolution. He won many wars and built large empire that ruled over much of continental Europe before its final collapse in 1815

L' Haiti

Haiti is an island of Hispaniola with the Dominican Republic to its east. Though it's still recovering from a 2010 earthquake, many of Haiti's landmarks dating to the early 19th century remain intact. These include Citadelle la Ferrière, a mountaintop fortress, and the nearby ruins of Sans-Souci Palace, the baroque former royal home of King Henry I.


EXCHANGE PROGRAM WITH TOWNLEY GRAMMAR SCHOOL



Coming from a poverty-struck household to becoming one of the most popular football players of France, Frank Ribéry is, undoubtedly, one of the best examples of rags to riches.

Frank was born in the city of Boulogne-Sur-Mer, famous for its major fishing ports, to parents who did odd jobs for their living.

When he was only two, a tragedy struck his family. Their car collided with a lorry which sent young Frank crashing through the windshield. After the accident he got a hundred stitches on his face which left two deep scars on his face.

Frank's childhood was a misery. Throughout his childhood people would stare and point at Ribéry in the street, saying how 'ugly' the scars were. Due to his disfigurement he got into a lot of violent fights. As an adolescent, Frank was also fired from a training academy for his repeated violent behavior. Wherever he went, people used to stare at him because of his disfigured face.

But he did not let this deter him. His scars only made him more committed to succeed as one of the best wingers in the modern football. His story tells that even though childhood wounds are sometimes impossible to forget, they can become a powerful force in our adult life and turn us into a true champion.


